A Local Law to Regulate the Licensing, Identification and Control of Dogs within the Village of Chaumont

### **ARTICLE 1: Statement of Authority:**

This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the provisions of Article 7 of the NYS Agriculture and Markets Law, Article 4 of the Village Law and Sections 10 and 20 of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York.

### **ARTICLE 2: Statement of Purpose and Findings:**

The Village Board of the Village of Chaumont, County of Jefferson, hereby finds it necessary to amend current law to reflect the transfer of responsibility from Jefferson County to the Town of Lyme for licensing, identification and control of dogs. The purpose of this law is to adopt comprehensive regulations for the licensing and identification of dogs, the control and protection of the dog population and the protection from dog attack and damage to persons, property, domestic animals and wildlife.

### **ARTICLE 3: Enactment:**

The Village Board of the Village of Chaumont hereby adopts the Village of Chaumont Dog Control Law as follows:

#### Section 1: Title:

Dog Licensing and Control Law of the Village of Chaumont

#### Section 2: Definitions:

All terms not specifically defined herein shall have the meaning assigned to such terms within §108 of Article 7 the Agriculture and Markets Law of the State of New York.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

- "Agriculture and Markets Law" means the Agriculture and Markets Law of the State
  of New York in force as of the effective date of this Law, and as may thereafter be
  amended from time to time
- 2. "Dangerous Dog," as also defined in Article 7, means any dog which, without justification:
  - (a) Attacks a person or companion animal and causes physical injury or death or
  - (b) Behaves in a manner which a reasonable person would believe poses a serious and unjustified imminent threat of serious injury or death to a person, companion animal or domestic animal, or
  - (c) Without justification, attacks a service dog, guide dog or hearing dog and causes physical injury or death
- 3. "Dog" means any member of the species canis familiaris
- 4. "Dog Control Officer" means an individual appointed by the Village to assist in the enforcement of this Article
- "Identification Tag" means a tag issued by the Lyme Town Clerk which sets forth an identification number, name of the municipality and state, contact information for the Lyme Town Clerk and such other information deemed necessary by the municipality
- 6. "Owner" means any person who harbors or keeps any dog, is entitled to claim lawful custody and possession of a dog, who is responsible for purchasing the license for such dog. Any person owning or harboring a dog for a period of one (1) week prior to the filing of any complaint charging a violation of this Local Law shall be deemed to be the owner of such dog.
- 7. "Owner of record" means the person in whose name a dog was last licensed pursuant to this Law, except that if any license is issued on application of a person under eighteen years of age, the owner of record shall be deemed to be the parent or guardian of such person.
- 8. "Person" means any individual, partnership, corporation, association or other organized group of persons, business entity, municipality or other legal entity.
- 9. "Resident" means any individual who maintains a residence within the Village of Chaumont, County of Jefferson, State of New York.
- 10. "Service Dog" means any dog that has been or is being individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of a person with a disability.
- 11. "Village" means the Village of Chaumont, County of Jefferson, State of New York.
- 12. "Village Board" means the Village Board of the Village of Chaumont.
- 13. "Village Clerk" means the Village Clerk of the Village of Chaumont.

### Section 3: Licensing of Dogs; Rabies Vaccination Required

1.a. No person shall own or possess a dog within the Village unless such dog is licensed and identified as provided in Article 7 of the NYS Agriculture and Markets Law and this Local Law. All dogs within the Village that are four (4) months of age or older, unless otherwise exempted, shall be licensed. No license shall be required for any dog which is under the age of four months.

#### b. Application:

The owner of any dog requiring licensure shall obtain, complete and return to the Town of Lyme Clerk, a dog license application together with the application fee, proof of spay or neuter, any applicable license surcharges and such additional fees as may be established by the Town, pursuant to the authority of this Law. The application for license shall be on a form prescribed by and available from the Town of Lyme Clerk, either in person or by mail. In no event will there be refunds of fees.

c. <u>Licenses issued by Animal Shelters and Pounds:</u>

The Village does not allow the licensing of dogs by a shelter. The shelter MUST send any prospective adopter to the Lyme Village Clerk for licensing before the adoption is complete.

- d. Grace Period for Dogs Licensed in New York City or Outside New York State:

  Any dog harbored within the Village which is owned by a resident of New York
  City or licensed by the City of New York, or which is owned by a non-resident of
  New York State and licensed by a jurisdiction outside the State of New York
  shall, for a period of thirty (30) consecutive days while within the Village be
  exempt from the licensing and identification provisions of this local law.
- e. <u>No license shall be transferable</u>. Upon the transfer of ownership of any dog, the new owner shall immediately apply for a new license for the dog. A license cannot be transferred to another dog.

### 2. Proof of Vaccination against Rabies:

Each license application shall be accompanied by proof that the dog has been vaccinated against rabies or a statement from a licensed veterinarian that such vaccination would endanger the dog's life in which case vaccination shall not be required.

#### 3. Purebred Dog License and Fee:

There will be no distinct purebred licenses as provided for by the State. Any purebred licenses previously issued will now be required to comply with this Local Law.

### 4. Term of License and Renewals:

Each license issued pursuant to this local law, shall be valid for a period of one year and shall expire on the last day of the last month of the period for which it was issued. No license shall be issued for a period expiring after the last day of the eleventh month following the expiration date of the current rabies certificate for the dog being licensed.

#### Section 4: Fees:

#### 1. Schedule of Fees:

The Village Board of the Village of Chaumont, County of Jefferson, is hereby authorized to adopt and establish by resolution a schedule of fees for dog license, enumeration, impoundment and replacement tags. The Village Board may exercise its authority under this Section to adopt and amend such schedule of fees as it deems appropriate.

#### 2. Administration:

All fees collected will be used in funding the administration of the Lyme Dog Control Law

#### 3. Service Dog Exemption from License Fees:

There shall be no fee for any license issued for the following types of dogs, as defined in Article 7 of the State Agriculture and Markets Law: guide dog, hearing dog, service dog, war dog, working search dog, detection dog, police work dog and therapy dog. Each license for such dog shall be conspicuously marked either "Guide Dog, "Hearing Dog," "Service Dog," "Working Search Dog," "War Dog," "Detection Dog," "Police Work Dog" or "Therapy Dog", as may be appropriate.

#### 4. Surcharges:

In addition to the license fee charged in accordance with subdivision one of this section, the Town of Lyme is required to provide for the assessment of an additional surcharge of at least one dollar for altered dogs and at least three dollars for unaltered dogs. Such surcharges shall be submitted to the Commissioner of NYS Ag & Markets for the purpose of carrying out animal population control efforts.

## Section 5: Issuance of License; Identification Tag:

- 1. Upon validation by the Town of Lyme Clerk, a dog license shall be issued and a record of its issuance retained in the office of the Town of Lyme Clerk. Such record shall be made available upon request to the State Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets, or successor thereof.
- 2. The Town of Lyme Clerk shall assign to each dog a permanent municipal identification number when it is first licensed. Such identification number shall be carried by the dog on an identification tag which shall be affixed to the collar of the dog at all times.
- 3. An identification tag is not required to be worn while the dog is participating in a dog show.
- 4. The official permanent identification number shall constitute the official identification of the dog to which it is assigned, regardless of changes of ownership, and the number shall not be reassigned to any other dog during the lifetime of the dog to which it is assigned.
- 5. No tag carrying an identification number shall be affixed to the collar of any dog other than the one to which the number has been assigned.

6. At the time a dog is first licensed, one identification tag shall be furnished to the owner at no charge. Replacement tags shall be obtained by the owner at the owner's expense, pursuant to the Schedule of Fees established by the Town of Lyme Board.

### Section 6: Change of Ownership; Lost or Stolen Dogs

- 1. Upon the transfer of ownership of any dog, the new owner shall immediately make application for a license for such dog. The original issued identification tag shall remain the same for the life of the dog.
- 2. In the event of a change in ownership of any dog which has been assigned an official identification number or in the event of a change of address of the owner of record of any such dog, the owner of record shall, within ten days of such change, notify the Town of Lyme Clerk.
- 3. If any dog which has been assigned an official identification number is lost or stolen, the owner of record shall, within ten days of the discovery of such loss or theft, notify the Town of Lyme Clerk.
- 4. In the case of a dog's death, the owner of record shall so notify the Town Clerk no later than the expiration date of the license.

#### Section 7: Restrictions:

It shall be unlawful for any owner of any dog in the Village to permit or allow any dog to:

- Run at large unless the dog is under the full control of its owner or a responsible person with the owner's permission. For the purpose of the Local Law, a dog in the company of a hunter shall be considered as accompanied by its owner.
- 2. Engage in habitual and loud howling, barking, crying or whining or conduct as to unreasonably and habitually disturb the comfort or repose of any person other than the owner of such dog.
- 3. Uproot, dig or otherwise damage any vegetables, lawns, flowers, garden beds or other property without the consent or approval of the owner.
- 4. Chase, jump upon or at, or otherwise harass any person in such manner as to reasonably cause intimidation or fear or to put such person in reasonable apprehension of bodily harm.
- 5. Habitually chase, run alongside or bark at motor vehicles, motorcycles or bicycles while on a public street, highway or place, or upon private property without the consent or approval of the owner of such property.
- 6. Create a nuisance by defecating, urinating or digging on public property, or on private property without the consent or approval of the owner of such property.
- 7. Be off the owner's premises or unrestrained by a leash, when in heat.

### Section 8: Procedure for Seizure of Dogs

- 1. The Village Dog Control Officer, peace officer or police officer may seize a dog as follows:
  - a. Any unlicensed dog whether on or off owner's premises
  - b. Any dog not wearing a tag which is not on the owner's premises, and
  - c. Any dog found to be in violation of paragraphs (a)-(g) of Section 4 of this Local Law, such dog to be kept and managed in accordance with the provisions of Article 7 of NYS Agriculture and Markets Law and in conformity with any order of the Village Justice of the Village of Chaumont.
- 2. The Dog Control Officer or peace officer observing a violation of this Local Law shall issue an appearance ticket for such violation.
- 3. Any person who observes a dog in violation of this Local Law may file a complaint under oath with the Town of Lyme Justice Court specifying the nature of the violation, the date thereof, a description of the dog and the name and residence of the owner, if known. Such complaint may serve as a basis for enforcement of the provisions of this Law.

#### Section 9: Violations:

- 1. It shall be a violation, punishable as provided in subdivision two of this section, for:
  - (a) any owner to fail to license any dog:
  - (b) any owner to fail to have any dog identified as required by this article;
  - (c) any person to knowingly affix to any dog any false or improper identification tag, or tag for identifying guide, service or hearing dogs;
  - (d) any owner or custodian of any dog to fail to confine, restrain or present such dog for any lawful purpose under this article:
  - (e) any person to furnish false or misleading information on any form to be required to be filed with the Village of Chaumont
  - (f) the owner or custodian of any dog to fail to exercise due diligence in handling his or her dog that results in harm to any guide, hearing or other service dog;
  - (g) any owner of a dog to fail to notify the municipality in which his dog is licensed of any change in ownership or address;
- 2. It shall be the duty of the Lyme Dog Control Officer to bring an action against any person who commits any violation set forth in subdivision one of this section. The Village of Chaumont may elect to prosecute such action as a violation under the penal law or to commence an action to recover in a civil action.
  - (a) First violation: a fine of no less than \$25.00
  - (b) Second offense within a five year period: a fine of no less than \$50.00
  - (c) Third or subsequent offense within a five year period: a fine of no less than \$100.00

### Section 10: Repeal of Inconsistent Local Laws or Ordinances:

This Local Law shall supersede all prior inconsistent Local Laws, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations relative to the licensing and control of dogs within the Village. All prior inconsistent Local Laws, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations shall be, upon the effectiveness of this Local Law, null and void.

#### Section 11: Severability Clause

The provision of this local law is declared to be severable, and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or part thereof is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of any remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or part of this ordinance.

### Section 12: Effective Date

This local law was adopted at the Village Board of Trustees meeting on October 24, 2017 and shall be effective after filing with the Secretary of State.
